

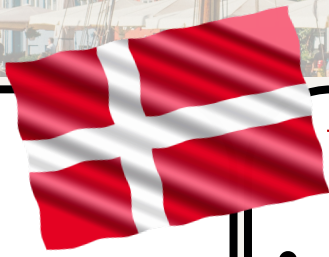

- Visa? No, for most nationalities, but check with Danish authorities



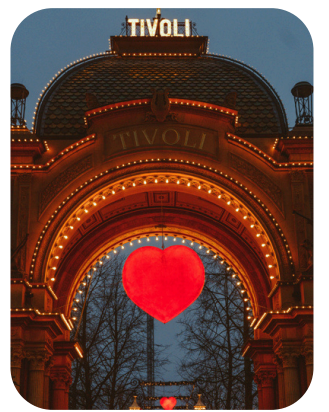
### WHERE TO STAY
